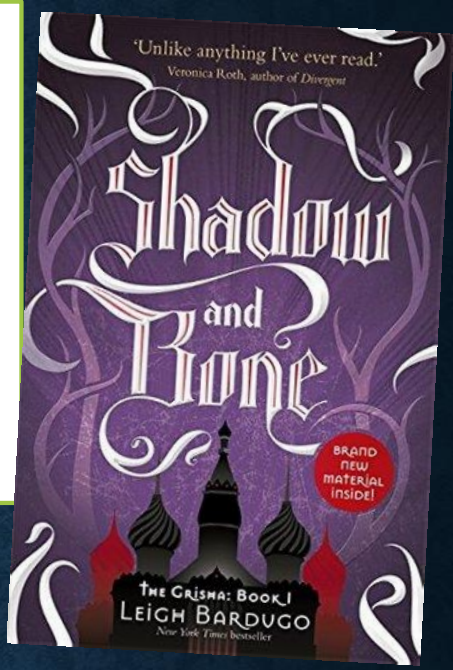


The Night Watch, Terry Pratchett (NB: adult rather than YA)

Orphans, magic, darkness: this is a spellbinding opening to an amazing trilogy which explores identity and classic fantasy themes of good/evil with a great female protagonist..



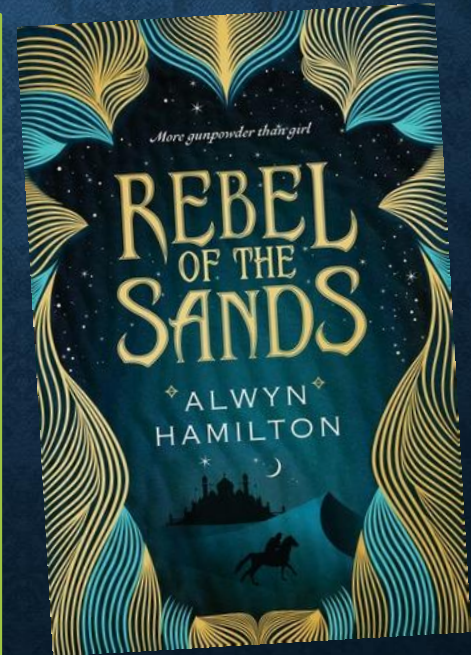
WEEKLY READING RECOMMENDATIONS
